


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

This memo reports on the total school-age population in Newton and the school-age children residing in Newton who are attending non-public or private schools during the 2022-2023 school year, as well as providing historical trend data. A census of non-public school students is conducted each January, as required by Massachusetts law, and provides information on where Newton's school-age population is attending school outside of Newton Public Schools. This includes private independent schools (including those with a religious affiliation), private special education schools, other public schools, charter schools, and students who are homeschooled. Special education students outplaced by Newton Public Schools are included in this census. The data reported in this memo is based on the 2023 non-public school student census that was conducted in January 2023.


Based on the January 2023 census, the overall school-age population in Newton (including public school and non-public school students) decreased by 220 students from last year (from 15,349 students in 2022 to 15,129 students in 2023), or a decline of -1.4%. The graph below displays the total school-age population in Newton from 2014-2015 through the current year. The total school-age population began declining in the 2018-2019 school year, which is also when the growth trend that NPS was experiencing shifted to one of enrollment decline. Although the total school-age population remained relatively stable in the 2019-2020 school year, the total population has continued to decrease in each subsequent year. One of the main factors of this trend is incoming kindergarten cohorts that are smaller than the prior year's graduating twelfth grade cohort. The size of the overall kindergarten cohort in Newton has declined in each year since 2018-2019, from 1,011 kindergarteners in 2018-2019 to 886 kindergarteners in the current year.



In 2022-23, 22.3% of the school-age population, or 3,381 students, are enrolled in non-public schools. This is a decrease of 158 students from the previous year, when 23.1% of the school-age population (3,539 students) was enrolled in non-public schools. Although both the overall number and the percentage of the school-age population enrolled in non-public schools has decreased in the current school year, both are still above the levels seen prior to the pandemic. As displayed in figures 1 and 2, both the overall number and the percentage of the school-age population enrolled in non-public schools increased in the 2020-2021 school year (with the majority of the increase likely due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic).



The decline in the overall number and percentage of students in non-public schools this school year is mainly due to a decrease in elementary non-public school enrollments. As Figure 3 shows, the percentage of the school-age population enrolled in non-public schools at the elementary level has decreased to 19% this year, although it is still higher than pre-pandemic. Overall, enrollments in non-public schools for elementary grades has declined by 116 students (-9%) from last year. As shown in Table 1 at the end of this memo, the individual cohorts of students at the elementary level have also seen cohort decline from last year, indicating that students in these cohorts have left non-public schools (either to return to NPS or to move out of Newton). In middle and high school, the percentage of the school-age population enrolled in non-public schools has decreased slightly this year, although again, both remain above the pre-pandemic levels. In middle school, the individual cohorts of students in non-public schools in all three grade levels has increased from last year, which is typical for Newton. In high school, there has been small cohort growth for the current ninth graders (+9 students) from last year. Prior to the pandemic, Newton usually saw cohort decline in non-public school enrollment from grade 8 to grade 9; since the pandemic, Newton has seen small cohort growth in this grade level transition.



The table below shows the breakdown of non-public school enrollment by type of school in 2022-23. The majority of the school-age population in Newton that is enrolled in non-public schools is enrolled in private schools in Massachusetts (95%), which is typical for Newton.

Of the students enrolled in private schools in Massachusetts (in-state private school), 24% are enrolled in private schools that are physically in Newton (including private special education schools), while the remaining 76% attend private school outside of Newton.

Just over a quarter (27% or 918 students) of all students enrolled in non-public schools in 2022-2023 are enrolled in private schools with a religious affiliation.

The following three tables provide additional detail on non-public school enrollment by grade level, grade level and NPS districted school, and outplaced students. Table 1 displays non-public school enrollment by grade, while Table 2 presents this information further separated by districted school. Table 3 displays the distribution of Newton Public Schools students who are placed out-of-district as of the time of the census due to the special education needs of the students by grade level and districted school.

Table 2 indicates that the percentage of the school-age population enrolled in non-public schools varies widely by districted school, especially at the elementary level. In elementary school, the percentage of the school-age population enrolled in non-public schools ranges from 6.5% in the Williams district to 42.4% in the Ward district, with an overall elementary percentage of 19% in non-public schools. In middle school, the percentage

of the school-population enrolled in non-public schools ranges from 17.6% in the Day district to 29% in the Bigelow district, with an overall middle school percentage of 24.4%. In high school, the percentage of the school-age population enrolled in non-public schools in the North district is 22% and the percentage in the South district is 27.9%.

Table 3 displays the enrollment for students with special education placements out-of-district and indicates that in January 2023, 117 students were placed out-of-district. In the prior year, 113 students were placed out-of-district.
