- 100% Unanimously selected by our curriculum selection committee
- 120+ hours of professional development for teachers, special educators, literacy specialists, and principals
- 2,500 K-2 students engaged in daily rigorous, complex, and engaging literacy instruction
- 320 educators equipped with knowledge and skills to effectively teach literacy with HQIM
- 206 active users of online digital platform for teacher and student resources
- 5 schools with grades 3-5 early adopting teachers
- 4 schools receiving targeted implementation support through UnBoundEd

## Content Area Updates

- Launched K-8 Fine Arts Department Professional Development in the areas of Neuroscience and the Arts, <u>Berklee Institute for Accessible Arts Education</u> and UDL and the Arts, <u>CAST</u>
- Social Studies 8th Grade MCAS will be field tested in all 4 middle schools this spring
- Continuing shift towards Acquisition Driven Instruction in World Languages
- MS ELA received NSF funding for teacher collaboration time and materials to support development of a new 6th grade novel study and continued professional development around the <u>Key Comprehension Routine</u> targeting reading comprehension across content areas
- ST Math active in all 15 schools as part of Tier I instruction, data is very promising
- **Science** is field testing OpenSciEd elementary curriculum as part of DESE-funded initiative/grant: 19 K-2 teachers across 4 schools, 2-year field test (2023-2025).
