She has managed events at least 3 different National Democratic conventions and had the honor of being elected as an Obama delegate at the 2012 convention in Charlotte, and as a delegate for Harris this year in Chicago. Her political work spans local, state and national races. Most recently she served on the Northeast finance committee for the Harris/Waltz campaign.

I believe the passion Ms. Stout brings to all sectors of her work and society, building communication and harnessing the power of community eminently qualifies her to be President of the 2024 Massachusetts Electoral College. It is also noteworthy that she will be the first Black woman in Massachusetts history to lead us, which is fitting as we cast our votes today for Kamala Harris, the first Black woman to head a major party ticket for President of the United States.
