- Be fair to our employees; keep them safe; give them the tools they need to be productive; make Newton a positive place to work
- Pay attention to "revenue growers" and "budget busters"
- Forecast revenues responsibly and stay committed to fully funding expenses
- Match recurring revenue with recurring expenses, and one-time revenues with one-time expenses
- Stay financially strong

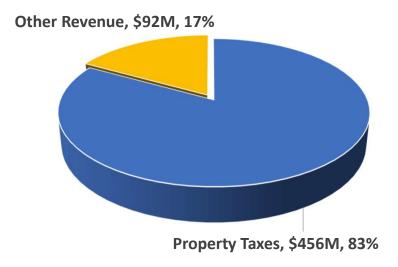

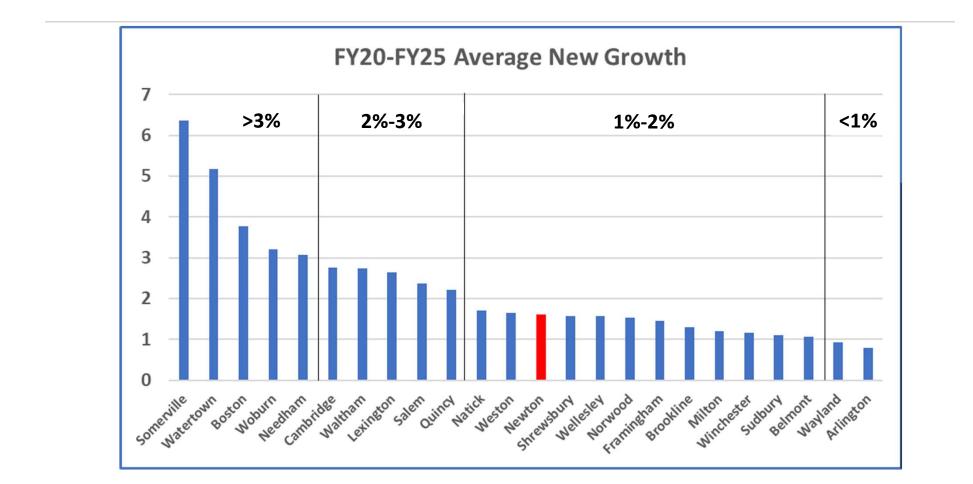
Keeping Newton Safe

FY2026 – Total Revenue ≈ \$548 M

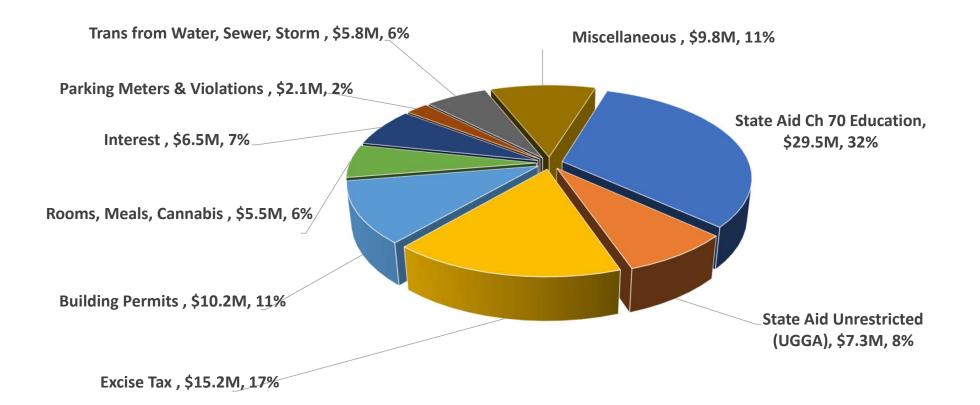


• Most revenues are stable and predictable

- Variable Growth: Excise, Building Permits, Ch 70, Interest*

Additional Revenue Challenges

• Federal Funding Uncertainties

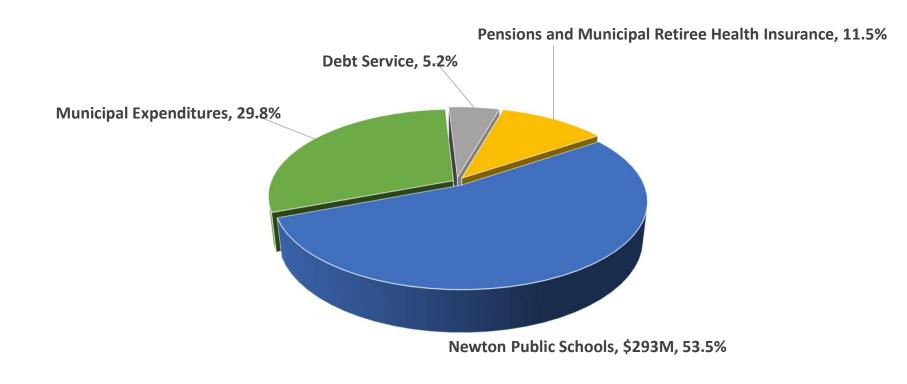

Additional Revenue Challenges

- <u>Relatively</u> Limited Exposure to Direct Federal Funding
- Grant Funds
 - Newton Public Schools \$4.99 million (SPED IDEA grant is \$3.5m)
 - SPED Medicaid Reimbursement \$800k-\$2.2 million/year
 - School Lunch Program \$1.5 million in 2024
 - Planning (CDBG, HOME, ESG) \$3.55 million
 - Fire Training approximately \$500k/year
 - Police intermittent grants
