His long career in public schools has given him the experience to know that a positive working environment for educators enables them to deliver excellent education for students. Teacher retention is critical for excellent schools. Bruce was an active board member of the Hudson Municipal Credit Union. He was instrumental in negotiating contracts through Interest-Based Bargaining.
